Noralynn, with strong Samoan lineages through her Su'afaiga, Mulipola, Auau, Lutu, Reed, and Scanlan families, supports her mixed-race gay son and his choreography, as a finalist on *So You Think You Can Dance*, touring with Lady Gaga, winning a Po'okela for choreographing Diamond Head Theatre's *Mamma Mia*, and more
